

- Store cereal in airtight containers or cans or resealable plastic bags.









Literature Links

- These books can be used to introduce the activity or as a follow-up extension.









Colorful Cereal Patterns


- Have children sort the Trix cereal.

- Play a matching game by matching the cereal patterns to the symbolic notation of the pattern. (ABAB...)



























